Kath has worked as a professional dance practitioner for over 30 years. She has a passion for historical dance forms and enjoys performing and teaching in the fields of Renaissance and Baroque, alongside her work in the more mainstream dance styles of contemporary, classical ballet and jazz. She also works as a choreographer and movement director, specialising in movement for actors.

The venue, the University of East Anglia, is on a 320 acre campus on the edge of Norwich: UEA, Norwich Research Park, Norwich NR4 7TJ. We will be staying in Broadview Hotel. There is very easy access from the rail and bus stations, and main roads if coming by car. Details will be sent on booking. The course will run from 5pm on Friday 11th April to 4pm on Sunday 13th April. Saturday afternoon will be free time. Accommodation is for two nights with all meals included.
